At one and the same time.**

**Brethren:** In our obligation as a Mason, we obligated ourselves “to help, aid and assist” all distressed worthy Brothers, their widows and orphans. Now is the time for us to put that obligation into practice.

**LIVING ALONE IS JUST AN ACCIDENT WAITING FOR A TIME AND PLACE TO HAPPEN!** Many of our older Brethren and/or their widows face obstacles everyday. One of their largest obstacles in living alone is having no one to check on their daily health and other needs. This could lead to disaster.

For example: an older Brother, and/or his widow may have any number of debilitating diseases: diabetes, high blood pressure, anemia, arthritis, etc., or any number of diseases that could leave you immobile and helpless in case of an attack. A good example is a chemical reaction to prescribed medication can lead to a diabetic coma where a loved one may lie helpless and possibly die before help or assistance may arrive. A stroke or heart attack may leave you speechless and immobile. A fall may break a bone leaving you helpless and unable to reach a phone. Any and all of these instances can be life threatening.

We strongly encourage slowing down and being more careful. When you get up from the bed or a chair, do so slowly. Pause for a few seconds to let all of your body functions get into their proper mode. It might be a good idea to get rid of “throw rugs” or any other loose items that might lead to a trip and fall.

Be especially careful at night; leave a “night-

light” burning. Older people have trouble with night vision and are especially vulnerable at night or even in the daylight hours when there is not enough illumination. A small “nightlight” in the bedroom or bath will cost very little to operate and they shine automatically only in dimly lighted areas and it more than pays for itself by the safety it provides.

Many in our fraternity are suffering from instability and have difficulty walking around in their homes. If you fit into this category, be sure to call a good Brother for help in the installation of “grab-bars” for your bathrooms and “hand railings” in rooms that will give you confidence and security walking within your home – especially in low lighting situations. This is especially important when you live alone.

A cordless phone or cellular phone is a “must” and is worth its weight in gold – if it is always with you or within arms reach – even when you go to take a shower or to the bathroom.

Many, many older people have accidents in the bathroom, resulting in immobility or a broken bone and need immediate assistance.

You can have a minor or even a MAJOR accident in the bedroom – living room – kitchen – pantry – front porch – back porch – or anywhere in the home. Ready access to a phone for emergency help or communications is an **ABSOLUTE NECESSITY**.

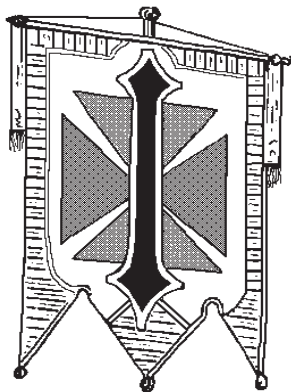

Pride is a great attribute but do not let pride get in the way of your health or safety!

There are many of our brethren, and/or their widows who live alone without any family member or close friend to help them in an emergency or just in the every day necessities of life. We must know who they are so that we may set up a "calling committee" of brothers and wives' to check on our needy Brothers, and/or their widows. They desperately need to know that someone sincerely cares about them.

Our intention and goal is to set up a system throughout our Masonic fraternity so that those Brethren, and/or their widow get called once a day just to see that they are OK and that their every day needs are met. Why are we here if not to help aid and assist our Masonic brother and/or his family?

Let us go a little further, let's check with each needy Brother, and/or his widow to see if they need someone to do whatever is necessary for a good quality of life. A phone call is a necessity but a visit is pure heavenly pleasure. Please go by for at least a short visit. It will put a star in your crown.

Let's check and see if the brother, and/or his widow would be willing to share a house key with a Brother or a reliable friend in order to get entrance to their home in case of an emergency. Some of our Brethren, etc., for security purposes and peace of mind, live in forts these days and the only way in is with a fire axe.

Please give this some thought. Please arrange to give a key to a good friend or friends or a Brother or Brothers and their wives or widow so that they may gain access to your home and help and assist you in times of emergency.

There is no reason that anyone should lie helpless on the floor or in bed for any length of time when a phone call to "911", a Brother, his wife and/or widow would produce immediate help. If there are other items we need to cover please contact your Lodge Master. Please let us help you enjoy the quality of life that you desire and are entitled to have.

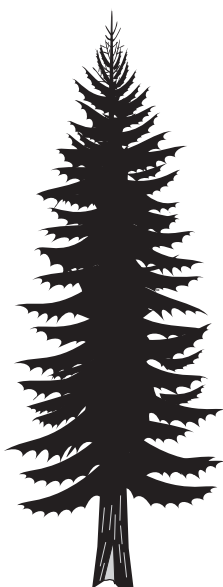

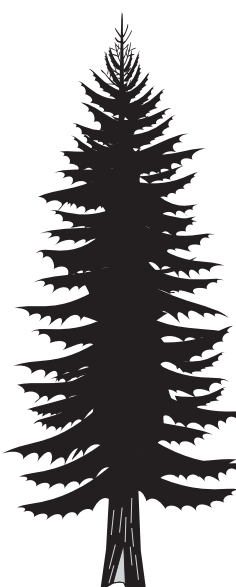
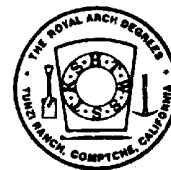

## Masonic Trivia

The Royal Arch Degree is considered the oldest of its Rite and is of the Cryptic or Secret Vault type. It first appeared in Faulkner's *Dublin* (Ireland) *Journal* for January 10 - 14, 1743, which reported that Youghall Lodge No. 21 celebrated St. John's Day with a parade in which there were "the Royal Arch was carried by two excellent Masons," presumably Past Masters. It was preferred by the Ancient Grand Lodge

# More Early History of the Grand Commandery

Following the 5<sup>th</sup> Conclave, the Grand Commandery was pretty quiet until the 11<sup>th</sup> Conclave. In the meantime, they had adopted the Order of Malta as a separate Order which had been approved by Grand Encampment. It is interesting to note that the Order came from the Boston Encampment which is the oldest Encampment in the US. During this period membership had increased to 381 members. Also a dispensation had been issued for Stockton Commandery on March 18, 1867 and charting was finalized on October 17, 1867

During the 11th Conclave, it was voted to move the annual meeting from October to April as was done by the Grand Chapter and Grand Council. The new meeting date would start in 1870 and would be held on the Monday following the first Tuesday in April.

At the 12th Conclave, it was sadly reported that our first Grand Commander, Isaac Davis had died and the current Grand Commander cited him as the founder of Templar Masonry on the Pacific Shores. A dispensation had been granted on December 11 1869 for "Coeur de Lion" Commandery in Los Angeles and the charter was granted on April 11, 1870. The meeting date was again discussed and after proper proposal, it was changed to the first Friday after the 2nd Tuesday in April.

The 13th Conclave showed that a dispensation was granted on April 12, 1870 for San Jose Commandery and it was chartered on April 15, 1871. The Grand Commander reported that he had installed the Officers of California Commandery #1 in their new building where the Grand Commandery would hold its Conclave in April of 1872. The Grand Commandery also approved that there should be appointed representatives to the other Grand Commanderies.

The 14th Conclave brought the news that the Grand Master of Masons had requested the Grand Commandery to assist in laying the cornerstone of the new City Hall and Law Courts of the City & County of San Francisco. California #1 was chosen to be the Escort for the Grand Lodge; however the Grand Commandery did not take part because they did not have any proper uniforms.

The 17th Conclave reported the following: there were now 33 Grand Commanderies with 45,000 members; it was resolved that the members of Grand Commandery be required to wear at its annual conclave the uniform of the order worn by their respective Commanderies. The Grand Commandery also adopted the amendment to the statutes. Section 11, Chapter 2: "The Grand Commander shall also exemplify, or cause to be exemplified, the ritual and drill of the Order at each Annual Conclave. He may also summon the Commander, Generalissimo, and Captain General of each Commandery to meet him at any convenient place

within the jurisdiction, for the purpose of exemplifying the drill and ritual, and the necessary expenses of these officers shall be paid by their respective Commanderies."

During the 18th Conclave, it was reported that the Grand Commander had issued a dispensation for Oakland Commandery on January 18, 1876 with Charter being issued on April 18, 1876. At this Conclave, two recommendations were adopted: They extended the time of resubmission of application from 6 months to 12 months and that the stations in the west will be appointed instead of elected.

During the 19th Conclave, the Grand Commander reported that he had issued dispensations for the following Commanderies: 1. Chico on June 6, 1877 and Lassen on June 10, 1877, they were chartered on April 14, 1877. The Grand Commander reported that he had received a request the Grand Master of Masons for an escort for the laying of the cornerstone at the First Baptist Church in San Francisco on the 5th of August and that California #1 has been selected as the escort.

Grand Commandery membership after the 19th Conclave stood at 853 members and it was interesting to note that in each of the proceedings were included the reports of the other Grand Commanderies.





## FREEMASONRY IN CALIFORNIA FROM 1848

The history of Freemasonry in California dates back to "the days of old, the days of gold, the days of '49." When gold was discovered in California many Masonic Brethren were among the crowds that poured into the district and several Lodges began work in the early part of the year 1848.

On May 10, 1848, the Grand Lodge of Missouri issued a charter to Saschel Woods, Master; L. E. Stewart, Senior Warden; Peter Lassen, Junior Warden; and other brethren, to form a lodge to be known as Western Star Lodge No. 98, at Benton City (Lassen's Ranch), California.

Later in the same year a charter was granted by the Grand Master of District of Columbia for the organization of California Lodge No. 13 (today California Lodge, No. 1), in San Francisco. This authorization was issued to Master Samuel York Atlee; Senior Warden William Van Voorhies; Junior Warden Badney F. McDonald; and their associates. Van Voorhies failed to qualify, as he decided not to journey to California as he had planned, and Levi Stowell was appointed in his stead. Forty-four Masons were present at the organization of California Lodge, No. 13, on November 17, 1849.

### Craft Masonry in California

Soon the question of establishing a Grand Lodge arose. A Convention met on April 18, 1850, of which Brother Charles Gilman of San Francisco was the Chairman and Brother Benjamin D. Hyam of Benicia was Secretary. The Lodges represented were California Lodge, No. 13, of San Francisco; Connecticut Lodge, No. 75, of Sacramento City; Western Star Lodge, No. 98, of Benton City, Upper California; and New Jersey Lodge of Sacramento City. Brother Benjamin D. Hyam presented credentials from Benicia Lodge, at Benicia, but, as no Masonic information of the existence of such a Lodge could be discovered, it was not recognized. On April 19, 1850, a Constitution was adopted and Grand Officers duly elected and installed.

### Royal Arch in California

The first Chapter of Royal Arch Masons, namely, San Francisco, No. 1, was organized by Dispensation dated May 9, 1850, and a Charter was granted to it on September 13, 1850. Three Chapters, San Francisco, No. 1; Sonora, No. 2; and Sacramento, No. 3, sent del-

egates to a Convention held on May 6, 1854, at Sacramento for the purpose of organizing a Grand Chapter. The meeting was adjourned, after three days' session, and met again at San Francisco, July 18, 1854, when a Constitution was adopted and the Grand Chapter opened. Companion Charles M. Radeliff, of Sonora Chapter, No. 2, was the first Grand High Priest; Companion John D. Creigh, of San Francisco, No. 1, Deputy Grand High Priest; and Companion Townsend A. Thomas, of Sacramento Chapter, No. 3, Grand Secretary.

### Cryptic Degrees in California

Charters were granted by the Grand Council of Alabama to two Councils in California. One was chartered by the Grand Council of Tennessee and one by the Grand Council of Texas. By representatives of these four Councils the Grand Council of California was organized on June 26, 1860.

### Commandery Orders in California

A Commandery of Knights Templar, San Francisco, No. 1, was formed on November 10, 1852, and was chartered on November 1, 1853. Under the Warrant of Sir William Hubbard, who was then Grand Master of the Grand Encampment of the United States, the Grand Commandery of California was established, August 10 and 11, 1858, in the Asylum of San Francisco Commandery, No. 1.

### Scottish Rite in California

A Lodge of Perfection, King Solomon, No. 3, was established by a Charter dated January 3, 1866; Robert Bruce, No. 3, a Chapter of Rose Croix, January 13, 1886; Hugues de Payens, Council of Kadosh, No. 3, January 7, 1886; and Los Angeles Consistory, No. 3, October 22, 1888. These four Bodies of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite labored in Southern California. In Northern California a Chapter of Rose Croix and a Lodge of Perfection, both by name San Francisco, No. 1, were chartered in 1868, the first on June 15, the second on July 13. A Council of Kadosh and a Consistory, also of the same name, were granted Charters on September 17, 1868, and June 30, 1897, respectively.
