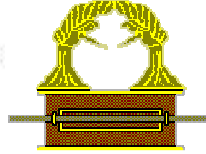

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## Grand High Priest's Message

### RITUAL – THE DEFINING CHARACTERISTIC

Dear Companions:

Sometimes eating seems to characterize our institution. Wherever I have gone this year, I have enjoyed wonderful food. Preceded, of course, by delicious appetizers – as if my appetite needed to be encouraged. And, as a result, I have gained a few pounds during the year.

But, despite appearances, eating is not the defining feature of our institution. The defining feature – the hallmark, of Freemasonry – is ritualistic presentation.

Ritual and lecture, coupled with speculative thought, is what makes us Masons. Through ritual, lecture and speculation we seek to understand the will of the Great Creator for our lives. We seek to learn how to shape and polish those stones that make the Temple of our character. If we are not doing those things, our Chapters may be very happy, very social, and very community spirited – but we are not Freemasons.

It is for this reason that I encourage you to attend one of the Grand Lecturer's current Officer's Schools of Instruction. The school in Bellflower was on February 28<sup>th</sup>, so you have missed that one. But here are two more, in Woodland and Union City, on March 21 and April 18. The details are elsewhere in this newsletter.

If you are an officer in one of our Chapters, please make every effort to attend one of these remaining schools. They will help you improve your understanding and presentation of our ritual. And that is central to what we do – teach through ritual and lecture.

But whether you attend a school this year or not, consider this – ritual IS the central and defining characteristic of the way we Masons do things. So be a part of your Chapter’s ritualistic presentation. Whether opening as an officer or as part of a degree team, learn the work and present it with beauty and majesty. **“Be the Change You Want to See.”**

## LEADING CHANGE

### **Do's and Don't's for High Priests**

Our Grand High Priest has made a strong appeal to “be the change you want to see.” Clearly that means that we as High Priests are to be leaders of change. What are the things that High Priests need to be aware of as they undertake the effort to lead change?

First, it will likely mean working together as a team. Make sure you as High Priest do not make decisions by yourself when you are encouraging teamwork. Further, do not forget to acknowledge those who contribute to the Chapter's effort in embracing change.

Second, listen carefully to what your chapter members are suggesting as you work towards change. All too often we forget that God gave us two ears and one mouth. We have a natural tendency to speak when we should be listening as the leaders of change.

Third, if your objective is to make changes that impact your Chapter over a longer period of time, do not push for quick results.

Fourth, be sure to include Companions with a wide variety of views. In other words, make sure you are not building a team with members who will unconsciously support whatever you propose as High Priest.

Fifth, change will likely mean thinking outside the box. As a leader of change make sure you are not pushing for the safe or secure solution.
