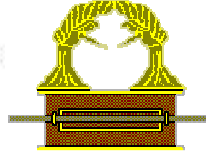

### GRAND HIGH PRIEST MESSAGE

#### CELEBRATIONS OF DEMOCRACY

I occasionally hear a complaint concerning our Stated Convocations. It goes something like this: *"It is boring to go to meetings to listen to the minutes, vote the usual bills and ballot on candidates who are almost certain of election."*

As Grand High Priest, I probably sit through more Stated Convocations than the average Companion. And sometimes I feel that way, too.

But when we feel that way, my Companions, we take for granted something very important. Our Chapter business meetings – yes, and those of our Lodges, too – can properly be seen as celebrations of democracy.

There are men and women fighting and dying this very day in many places in our troubled world over the right to do the very things that we do every month in our Stated Convocations. Things like meeting in private and keeping the nature of our discussions to ourselves – like correcting the official record of our proceedings when it is in error – like deciding how our money will be spent – and like casting a secret ballot upon important measures, such as who will be admitted to our deliberations and who will lead us.

Indeed, our business meetings are truly celebrations of democracy – embodying, as they do, the rights of self-government, secret ballot, etc. And they are celebrations that millions around the world would like to be able to enjoy so often and so regularly that they became common-place and a little boring for them.

In our Nation we have, by the Grace of God, pretty well resolved these issues. But not so everywhere, and nothing is guaranteed for the future. As we approach the 227<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the final signing of our Constitution – on September 17<sup>th</sup> – let us remember to be grateful, and perhaps see our sometimes boring Stated Convocations in a little different light.

### **EDITORIAL**

#### **I HAVE IT!**

A month ago, a fascinating book came out by a writer on food and nutrition science, Nina Teicholz, which has changed my life – in terms of physical health. While reading it, I made a connection between nutrition and the membership/attendance problems experienced by our organizations over the last 50 years. I share it with you as a *theory*. It is too important not to share – even if the connection I have made turns out to be incorrect, or only moderately close to correct. The nutritional realities will still hold True! What I have is the answer to the question that has plagued us all for decades: What is the problem with our membership and our attendance? The answer lies in NUTRITION! Now, this may seem half-baked, but the dietary practices recommended to us by errant public health authorities over the last 60 years has caused epidemics of significant diseases. The accompanying sicknesses have kept our brethren and sisters away from meetings – because they just don't feel like coming out! They still believe in our principles, and retain and value membership, but even if our meetings were

the most interesting things this side of Mozart, they still wouldn't come out! They don't feel good!

The High-Carb diets have done this to them, so the best thing we can do for membership retention and growth (because they are both closely related) is to get the word out to our brethren and sisters to switch from a High-Carb diet to a High-Fat diet. The carbs cause the release of Insulin which traps the fat in our adipose tissue. It's eating Carbs that makes us Fat, not the other way around. This leads to obesity, diabetes, heart disease, and so forth. This simple dietary change can make all the difference in the world to our loved ones, brethren and sisters, Lodges and Chapters.

Don't take my *theory* as the final word for the dietary effects on our bodies and our organizations. But Nancy and I have lost 7 and 4 pounds respectively over the last month, transitioning to a High-Fat diet! I recommend to you a number of well-researched books, any one of which will give you a fascinating understanding of the development of Public Health Policy in this country over the last 60 years, since Eisenhower's heart attack in 1954. *The revelations as to how Bad Science has trumped Good Science to give us dietary recommendations that are bad for our health is truly amazing.* The following are all available on Amazon:

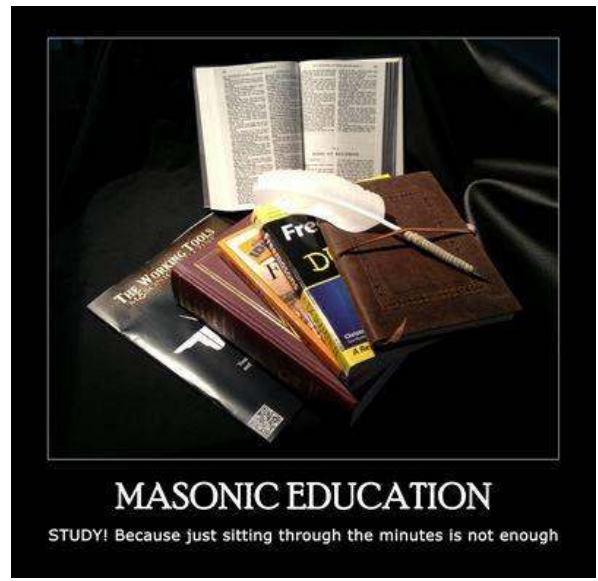
